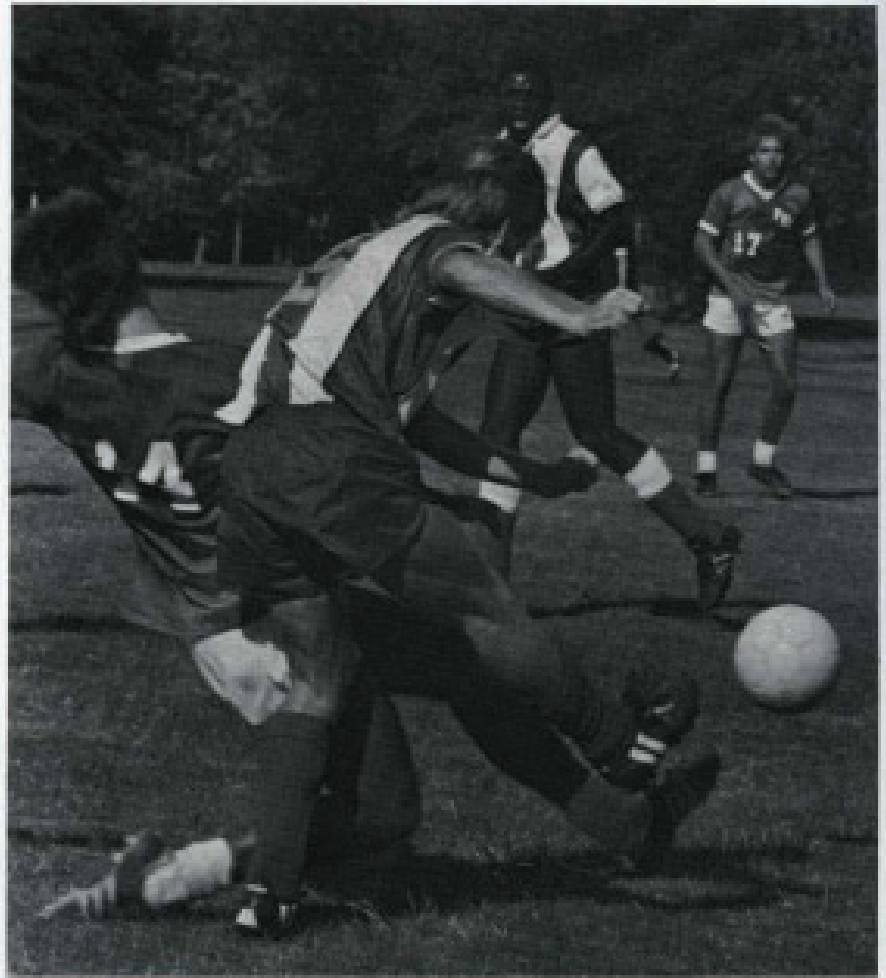
Soccer Team

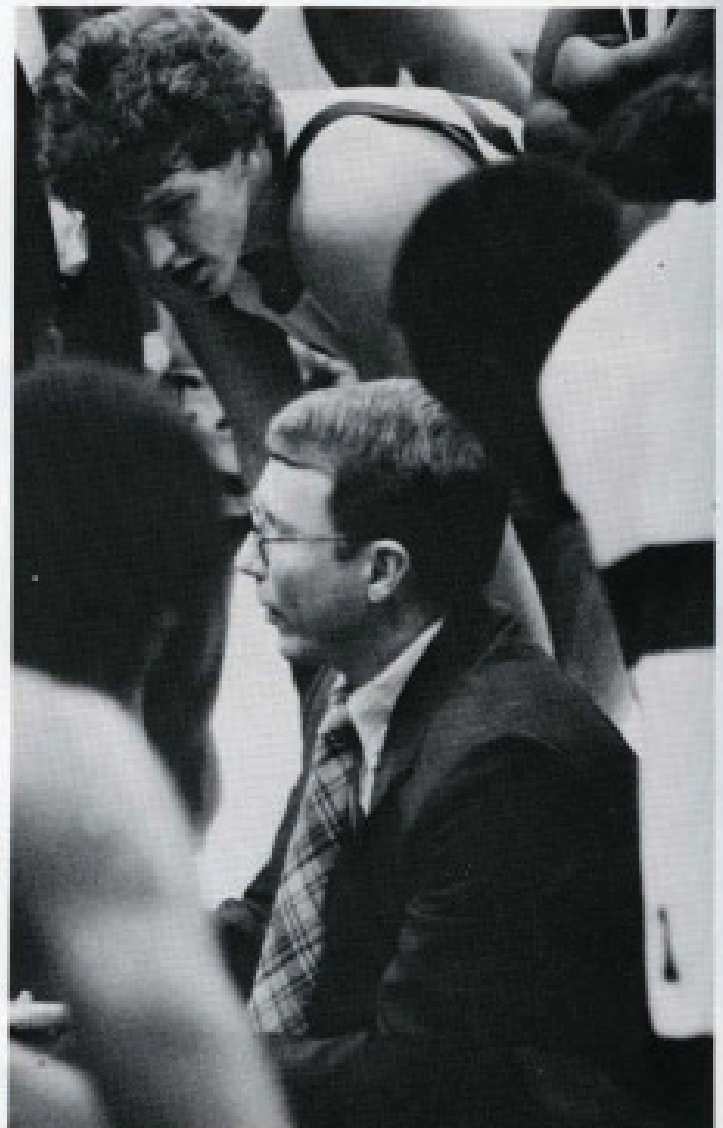
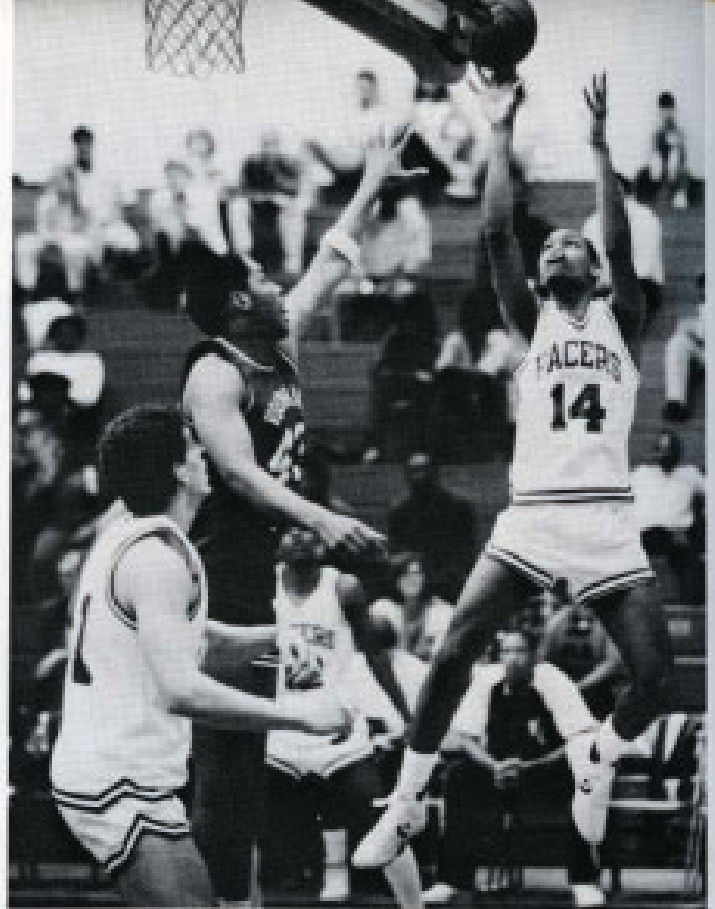
A Growing Force

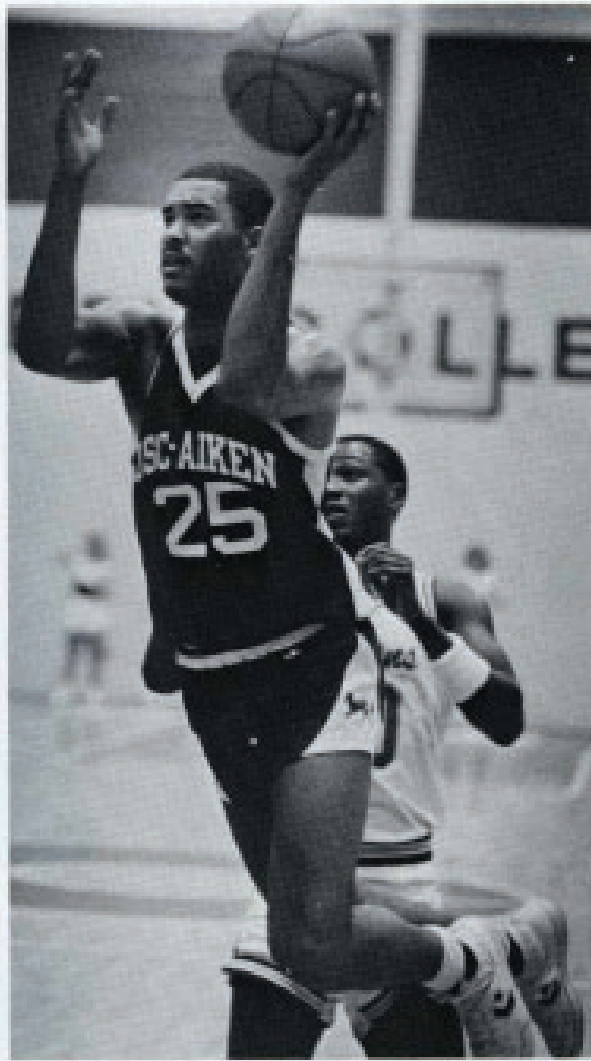
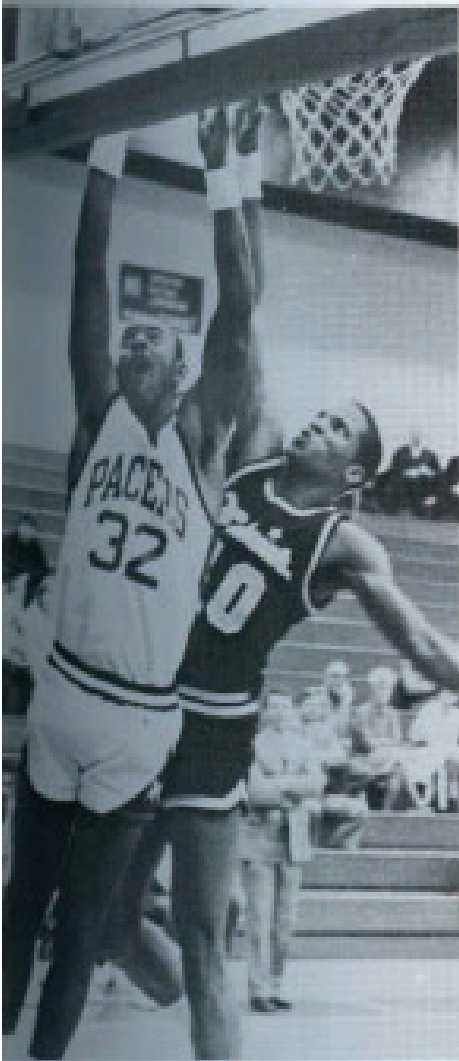

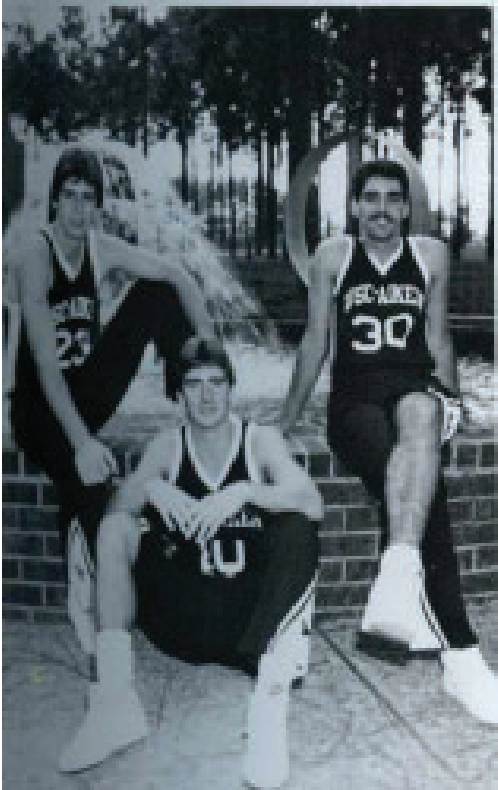

Growing Even Stronger

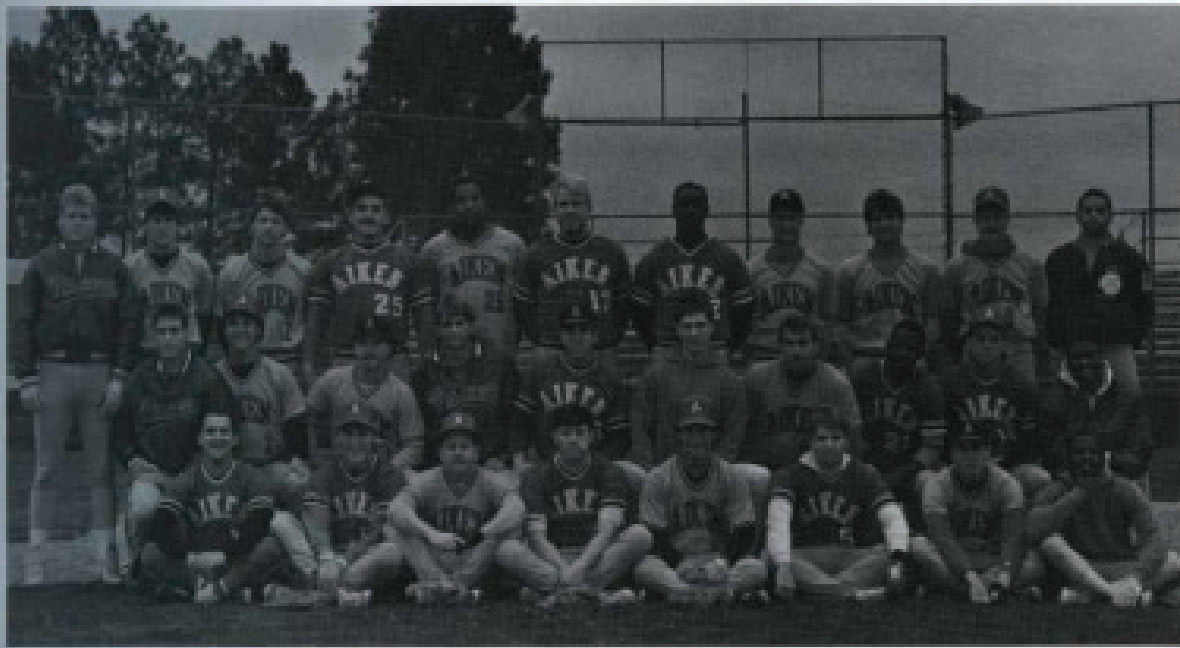
The women's basketball team is again a very young team overall. The Lady Pacer's returned five upperclasswomen from last year who will be the nucleus and probably the starting five for this season.

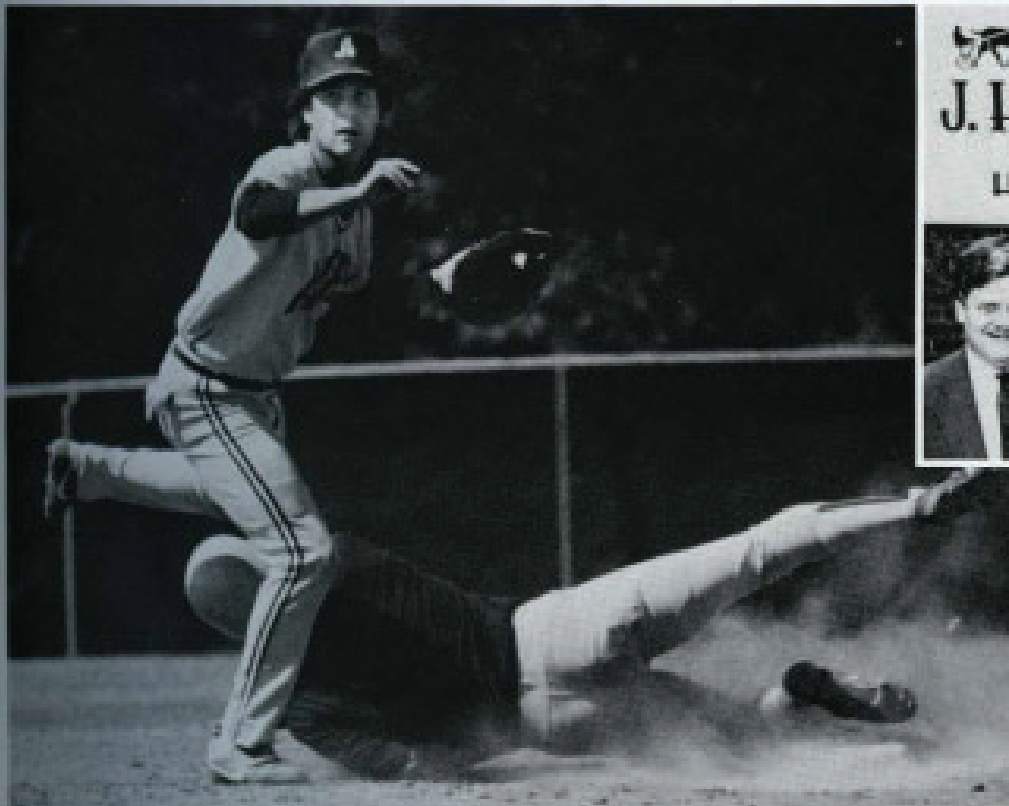
After a slow start, caused by the overlap of the volleyball season, the Lady Pacers expect to "get together" for a strong second season.

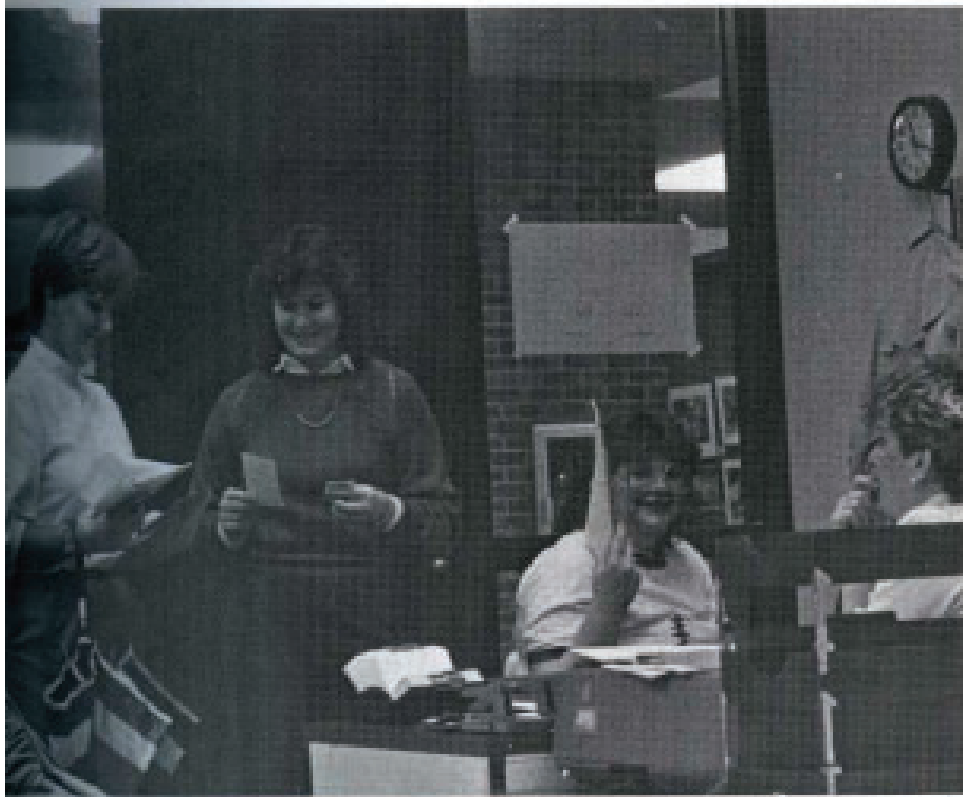
THE STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION

The 1985-1986 chapter of the Student Government Association is on the move with bigger and better things!!!!!!



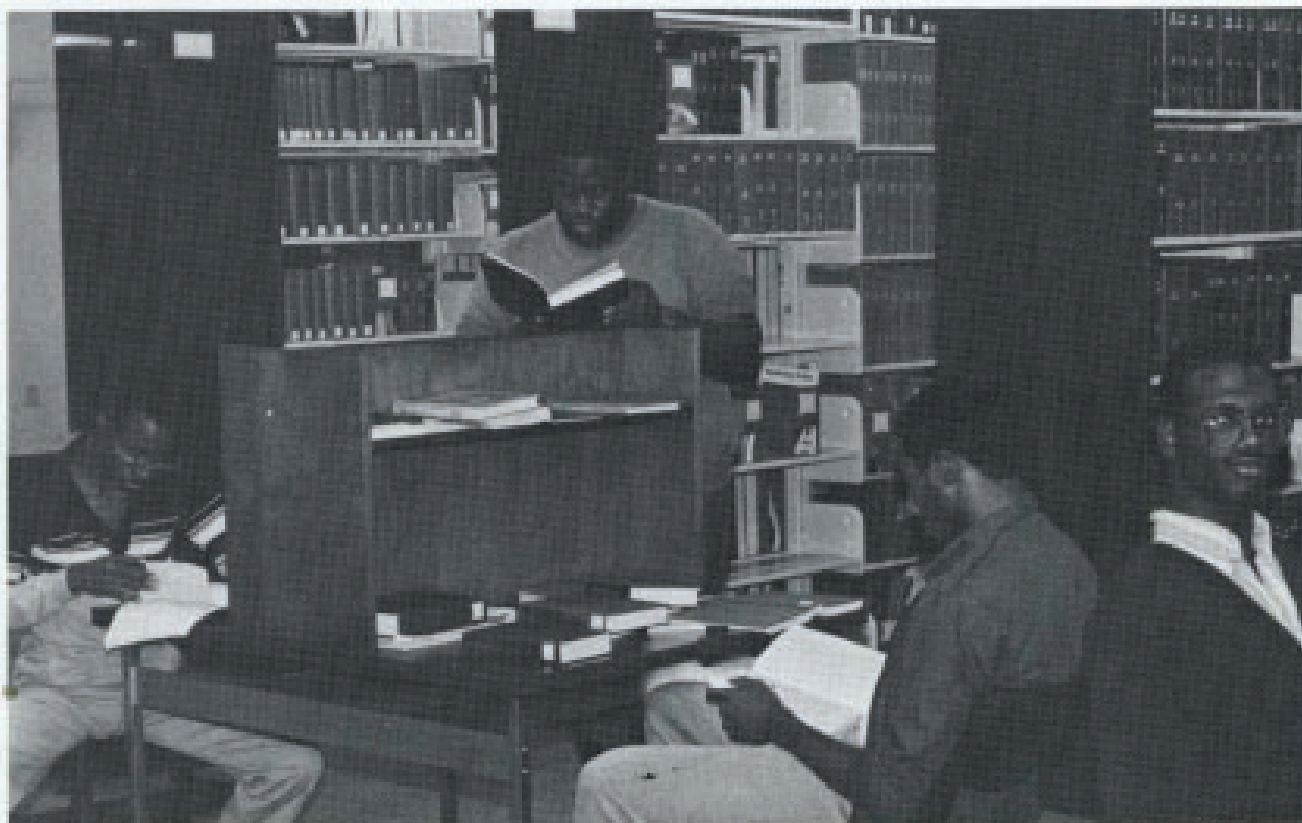
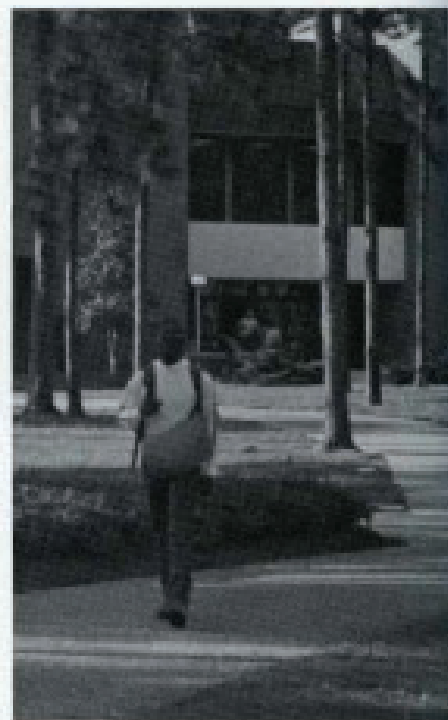

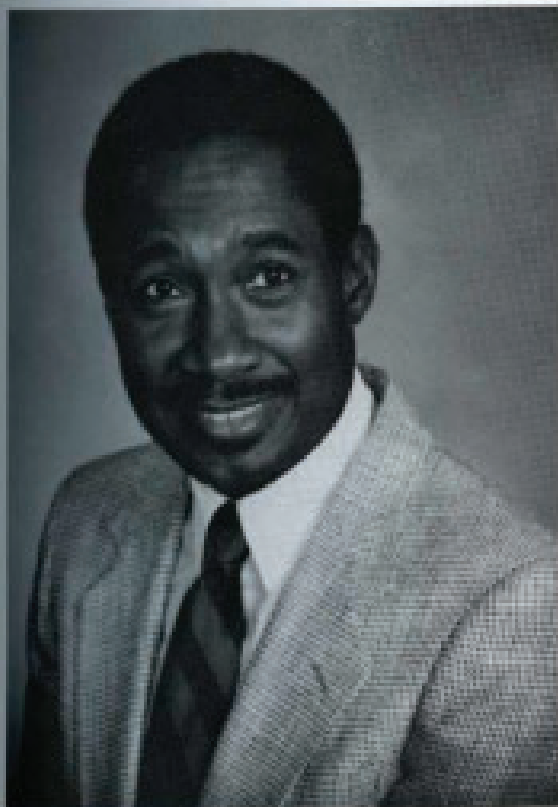

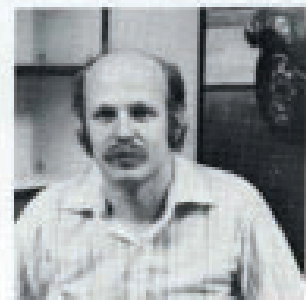


The Artist's Union

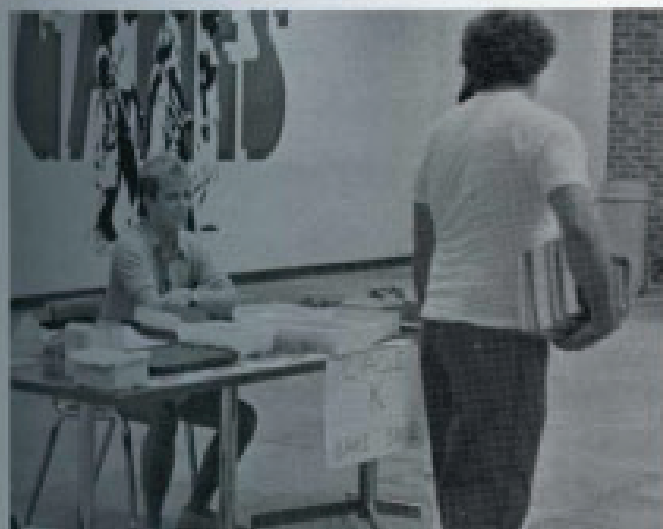

Encore is an organization for non-traditional students, 22 years of age and over. This organization is geared toward providing social enhancement to the non-traditional student.

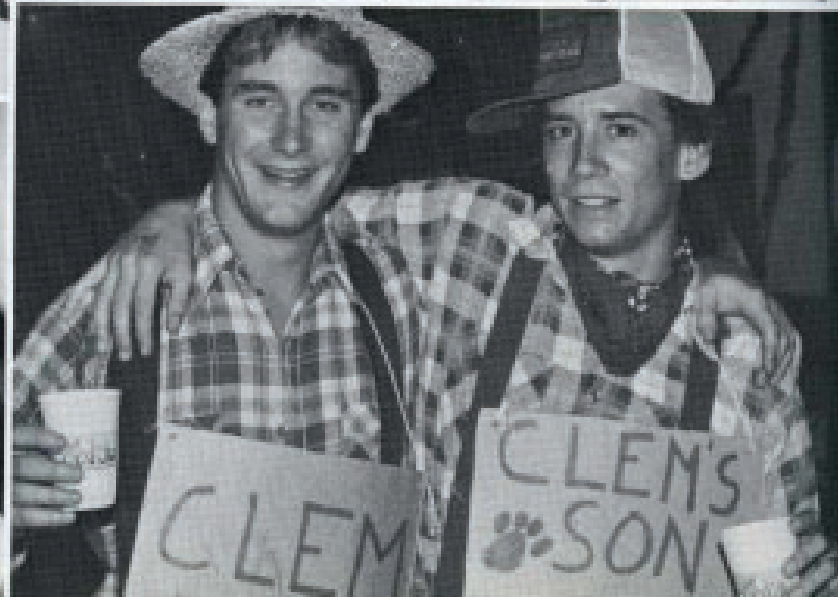

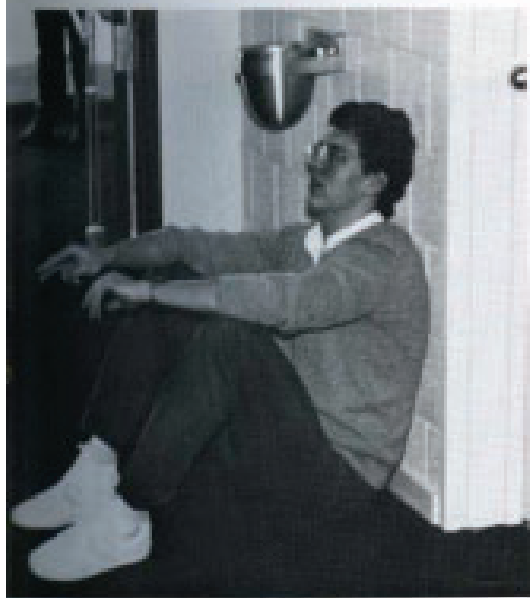
A Flourishing Organization

Kappa Omega Chapter was initiated in April 1982 at USCA. It averages between 25-35 members each semester. Alpha Kappa Psi is one of the largest national college fraternities. National has installed over 220 chapters, over 75 alumni chapters and over 122,000 members have been inducted.

Kappa Omega is active in school and community activities such as the Aiken Diabetes Foundation and the Career Day held on campus each spring. 1985 marked the first year Kappa Omega reached it's goal of 100,000 points in the performance evaluation. The fraternity received a plaque for its achievement in ranking No. 1 in the Southeast region. The southeast region also received first place at the national convention this past summer in St. Louis. 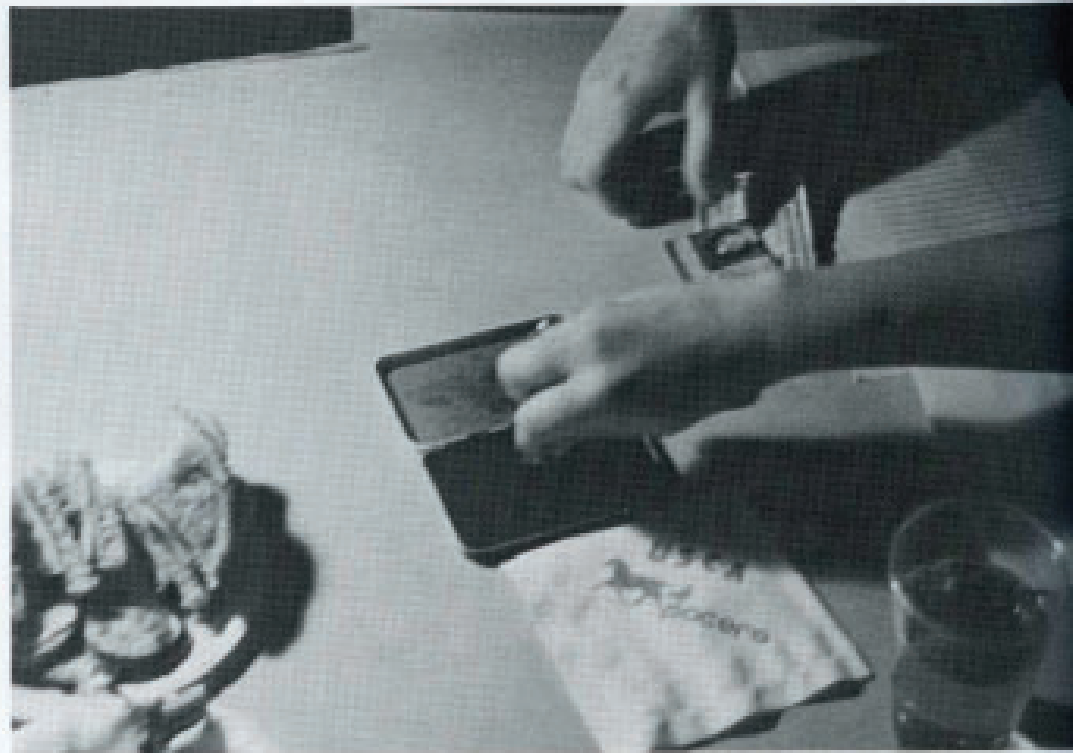

Pacer Union Board

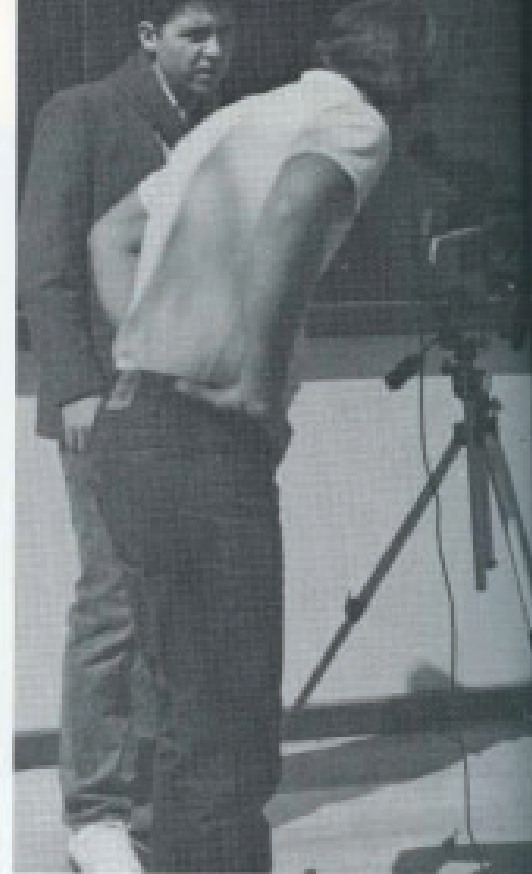
